



Health and Safety Professional (HSP) Designation Certificate Program

Want to turn your OH&S experience into a professional designation?

The Health and Safety Professional (HSP) Designation Certificate Program from Safety Services Canada offers a unique blend of practical and academic training that will take you to the next level in your health and safety career!



The HSP Designation Certificate requires 30 credits of mandatory and elective courses in a wide range of topics. You choose electives based on your interests and needs to make the program your own. When you have completed the program, you will be able to use HSP after your name like any other professional designation (CRSP, CA, etc.).

To be eligible for the HSP Designation Certificate Program and maintain your designation, you must:

- Presently hold a position or be pursuing a career path in Occupational Health and Safety;
- Be a member of your Safety Services Canada provincial office (either you or your employer);
- Continue to be involved in health and safety at your workplace after you complete the program; and
- Be committed to ongoing professional development in the field of OH&S.

The HSP Designation Certificate Program includes:

- 30 credits of SSC courses (one credit equals eight hours of training);
- A practical project; and,
- A final exam.

How long does it take to complete the HSP Designation Certificate Program?

The benefit of this program is its flexibility. Many participants pursue this training while holding full-time employment. Others may choose to study exclusively over a shorter period of time. Participants working full-time can likely complete the 30 credits within a two year period.

Can I transfer credits from other institutions to the HSP Designation Certificate?

- Yes, up to six credits
- All transfers must be approved and appropriate documentation is required.
